We have strived to dispel the notions that are attached to this label ever since we started almost a decade ago. At our heart, SHIFT is a neighborhood investor. Investing in the built environment to strengthen the communities where we invest. Working with neighbors, small businesses, entrepreneurs, funders, partners, and friends to support the communities where we invest. Showing up when and where we can to lend a hand to, stand up for, and be there for the communities where we invest.

These communities are coping with and tackling head on some of the most insufferable economic and social challenges our City (and the world) has bear witness to and failed to help solve. These challenges are

entrenched and generational, requiring time and a collective and collaborative effort to lay paths to solutions. We strongly believe the work we do is part of the solution base.

Our investments help turn vacated buildings into living rooms, places to dine, safe spaces for community services, and studios for creativity and experimentation. What we thoughtfully create helps to open doors and opportunities for small business production hubs, novel ideas and scientific breakthroughs, community-serving organizations, youth learning centers, safe quality homes for residents, and jobs for community members and Philadelphians. Programs, like our Good Neighbor Program, help to create bridges between residents and community members through supportive engagement. All to lay the groundwork for economic and social supports for the neighborhood, to provide safer and cleaner places for residents and businesses, and to develop stronger participation and relationships with neighbors.

2021 was a year of introspection for our team, helping us to strengthen our neighborhood connections and mission progress with more focused accountability and actions. We committed to certain workforce inclusionary goals for construction jobs, contracting, suppliers, and vendors as well as to attracting a more diverse mix of small businesses and entrepreneurs. Behind the scenes, our team laid the groundwork for project reporting and tracking that will hold us accountable to our project inclusionary goals.

2021 was also a year when we said we can do better for communities. We made a standing commitment to:

Continue to elevate local, emerging developers. We established our Developer-in-Residence program, a program that integrates mission-aligned developers, focusing on minority- and women-owned businesses, with our team to provide crosstraining in large-scale development and financing projects.

Set better standards in the real estate industry and continue to break the mold of real estate development. We invested in our models for impact measurement and reporting and established new mission-driven partnerships to actualize industry-wide best practices.

Invest in and with the Next Generation of impact real estate leaders. We are systematically investing in a stronger real estate ecosystem by bridging the barriers to entry. Our investments with diverse-led groups in Washington DC and Newark NJ has helped elevate locally led groups with ambitious impact agendas in their respective communities.

Our collective actions and the collective support of neighbors, partners, investors, and our team will continue to move us forward in making generational investments in people and places in Philly and beyond. Forward is the only direction we know.



Landmarks

Showcasing 2021 moments from our team, the small businesses we work with, and the neighbors we partner with.

Construction begins on 3200
Kensington Avenue. Sixteen
residences with street-level retailat the corner of Kensington and
Allegheny. "This intersection, known
as 'K&A,' is arguably [Philadelphia's]
largest heroin market and a hotspot
for gun violence." Residences will
open in 2022.



BioAnalysis LLC, a Black-owned, non-clinical research organization opens its HQ in Harrowgate, bringing scientists to MaKen South.



SHIFT worked with a group of primarily Latinx investors to guide them in becoming collective owners of a real estate portfolio of our previous properties in Kensington.

Partnering with the Norris Square Community Alliance, SHIFT was awarded the Mi Casa RFP to provide development support for building single family homes on vacant lots.

SHIFT joins The Menkifi Group—a 100% minority-owned Certified Business Enferprise missioned to transform lives, careers, and communities through real estate—and the community of Historic Anacostia in Washington DC to break ground on MLK Gateway II SHIFT's first project outside of Philadelphia.



SHIFT launches our Developer-in-Residence program to train and cultivate emerging developers.

Voyage Investments joins the program.

J-centrel opens and our Good Neighbor Program launches providing rent discounts for residents who volunteer or work in J-centrel's neighborhood.

Càphê Roasters open their first cafe in Philly; from Kensington Storefront Challenge winner to roaster and wholesale in MaKen North to full-service cafe at J-centrel.

SHIFT's Board membership on the Kensington Corridor Trust transfers to the community. SHIFT and neighborhood partners created the Trust to give the Kensington community control of real estate and capital along the Kensington Avenue corridor. SHIFT partners with Newark NJ-local developers, Hanini Group, and regional investor, CoInvestment Partners, to acquire and purchase three buildings in Newark's growing Central Business District. SHIFT's second project outside of Philly.

With each of our projects, our team factors economic mechanics and community needs to collectively strengthen the social fabric of communities. We believe considerations for residents, neighbors, and tenants, are as important as our financial considerations.

In 2021, our team continued to intentionally invest in projects that are transit-oriented, community-serving, and small business friendly, and that mix high quality design and delivery. We worked towards building thoughtful spaces and places that were inclusive, safe, and welcoming for everyone. With partners, we worked along some of Philadelphia's commercial corridors in the neighborhoods of Harrowgate/Kensington, Sharswood, and Nicetown-Tioga-North Broad Street, where we laid the groundwork to remove decades-old blight and add community-serving, essential businesses and services.

We lead real estate projects and programs driven by equitable development best practices.

Welcome to J-centrel

J-centrel is an adaptive-reuse of an old mill turned 116 apartment residences with an onsite cafe and ground-level retail and working studios for entrepreneurs and community-service services. J-centrel is accessible to Kensington Avenue, the main street that runs through Philadelphia's Harrowgate and Kensington neighborhoods.

At our J-centrel Opening Day, we gathered entrepreneurs, residents, and community members and partners to officially open our doors.



In 2021:

We welcomed 10 new small businesses to J-centrel and the Harrowgate community. We welcomed entrepreneurs delivering community-serving services, small business support for minority-owned businesses, food and beverage, and creative experiences.

We launched our Good Neighbor Program for residents to support the communities of Harrowgate and Kensington. Good Neighbor offers rent discounts up to \$100/month for residents who volunteer four hours of service with our partner organizations or who are an employee of a Good Neighbor Program partner.

We committed to providing a more sustainable way for residents to access everyday essentials. We partnered with The Rounds, a zero-waste refill and delivery service, to deliver household basics, personal care products, and pantry staples, right to residents. The Rounds work with local businesses to deliver pantry items and employ locally at their Neighborhood Refillment Centers.



Our project at 3200 Kensington Avenue offered complexities across financing, development, and construction, and with the realities of violence and drug-related incidents at its physical intersection. Uniting with partners, investors, and the community, our team overcame the challenges to be on track in 2022 to deliver a mix of street-level retail for community-serving businesses and quality living apartments for residents.



3200 Kensington gave us opportunities to employ local residents like Patrice, a longtime resident who has worked tirelessly to help people experiencing addiction and homelessness. Patrice provided site coordination while connecting with neighbors who inquired about the project.



Supportive services and living rooms

Sharswood Ridge is a commercial and residential anchor development that sits along the Ridge Avenue commercial corridor anchor in Philadelphia's Sharswood neighborhood. Mixed market rate and affordable apartment residences with street-level retail providing essential and supportive services to the neighborhood, including a grocery store, urgent care, eateries, and a community bank.



Sharswood Ridge broke ground towards the end of 2020, and our team and partners, Mosaic Development Group and the Philadelphia Housing Authority, took off in 2021 with ground-up construction.

Working together


We work together with our partners at the heart of North Philadelphia's Nicetown-Tioga and Hunting Park neighborhoods.

Monumental movement

SHIFT Builders, our in-house construction team, and our partners started the first phase of construction at the legendary Beury Building (3701 North Broad Street in North Philadelphia). During this phase, teams worked to clean out and repair the almost century-old structure to prepare it for full construction and development. When complete, the Beury will be transformed into a 138-guest room hotel with ground-level restaurants and café, a rooftop bar and restaurant, a fitness center, and meeting spaces. SHIFT continues to work with the community coalition of BGEC (Broad-Germantown-Erie Collaborative) to raise the bar of equitable development and community partnership.

Collective action

We partnered with The North Broad
Renaissance and other developers
along Philadelphia's North Broad Street
corridor to establish the North Broad
Real Estate Commission. NBREC's
goal is to drive equitable development
by aligning and unifying the ongoing
projects along North Broad Street. The
coalition provides opportunities for
developers to showcase projects, seek
support and input, and share resources.
We joined NBREC because we believe
a collective approach to neighborhood
investment best serves local businesses
and the community.



And, they have the ability to help businesses grow which in turn helps to create jobs for neighborhood residents.

BioAnalysis

Dr. Lake Paul, a scientist and entrepreneur, opened BioAnalysis, a Black-owned, minority-led, Kensington-based, non clinical contract research organization at MaKen South. Scientists at South provide research and analysis on Cell and Gene Therapy and biotherapeutics that have the potential to be life-changing.

The open floor plan, entire floor of windows giving us unheard of natural light, and the blank canvas giving us the ability to grow made MaKen an easy choice. You don't hear of many researchers setting up labs here in Kensington. They should think again."



Back in the day, ok about 4 years ago, Càphê Roasters operated a roastery and wholesale production out of MaKen North. In 2021, Càphê opened their first cafe as an anchor at J-centrel. Càphê's journey started with an idea, brewed with heart and a determination to never stop, and backed by a team of coffee connoisseurs and imbued by family and heritage. The lines were out the door, and the experience, coffee, and food were on.



Intercultural Family Services

Intercultural Family Services open a neighborhood office at MaKen North.

Intercultural works toward stabilizing, strengthening, and uniting families, individuals and diverse communities through behavioral health, mental health, family enrichment, and prevention services.

Their beginnings were born out of their love for food and love of family, and experimenting while passing time during the pandemic.


Kismet Bagels

In 2020, Kismet Bagels opened their first commercial kitchen at MaKen North. A year later, a meteoric rise in bagels, schmears, bialys, and sammies sales, Kismet Bagels made moves towards opening their first brick and mortar shop in Philly.

Create forward



Lenapehoking / New York City-based artist Jess X. Snow brought us "The Future Is Worth The Fight, Just Hold On & You Will See" mural next to our J-centrel property with support from Mural Arts Restorative Justice Department's Women's Reentry Pilot Program participants and assisting artists Sonja John, Kah Yangni, Michael Konrad, and Malachi Floyd.

The mural features portraits and letters from a group of Philadelphia-based high school students and their families who were a part of a class examining Black and Indigenous and Diasporic People of Color-led alternatives to community care and safety that don't rely on local, state, or federal aid.

Space to work together

We donated our office space for a five-part Police Trauma Training Pilot Program for officers from the 24th District led by We CAN (Change & Action Now), an interagency collaborative among three community development corporations and community partners. The training, which focused on introducing officers from the 24th District to trauma-informed principles from a variety of perspectives, was a collaboration between Inspector Altovise Love-Craighead, head of the Philadelphia Police Department's Community Relations Bureau, resident Community Connectors, community youth, and the Creative Praxis training organization. We CAN implemented the pilot program with support from Captain Pedro Rosario of the PPD's 24th District. The training was part of We CAN's work to increase community cohesion, strengthen police and community relations, and reduce physical disorder in the Kensington and Fairhill neighborhoods of North Philadelphia.

Space to thank and commemorate

We donated space to members of the New York City Ballet and the New York City Ballet Orchestra to perform an interpretation of "Hallelujah" to "commemorate the lives we lost to COVID, honor healthcare workers and those who are moving mountains to bring us back together, and inspire hope and unity through the power of art." Space to create impact

Safe-Hub Philadelphia and the Block Gives Back, two non-profits focused on empowering communities, families, and kids, hosted their End of Year Jawn event at MaKen North. The event welcomed families from the Harrowgate and Kensington neighborhoods to share resources, host sports and activities, and provide toys and winter clothes.



Space to express

We donated space to multi-hyphenate artist, Gianni Blass Lee. Gianni served a two-month artist-in-residency at MaKen South.

We show up for our community to lend a hand, share our expertise, and amplify their voices.

Supporting strokes of love for the neighborhood

SHIFT supported local artists Linda Fernandez of Amber Art and Design and Carly Noella Najera, a local resident to secure funding form Mural Art's Neighborhood Yes Fund to create signage and a mural at Scanlon Playground in Harrowgate. The Neighborhood Yes Fund supports community projects led by residents who live in the neighborhoods of the proposed projects.

Carly Noella Najera, a Harrowgate resident, Kensington Soccer Club coach, and art teacher, met our team while designing Little Libraries for Mural Arts in the summer for 2021. Carly and her students from Mastery Charter School Lenfest Campus created a floral mural at the entrance of Scanlon. The mural brought students and community members together and created a joyful welcoming message to the playground.

Since 2017, Amber Art and Design have created in MaKen North Studios, which overlooks Scanlon Playground. Their mission is to leverage art from a point of renewal and service: inviting communities and individuals to advocate for positive change. They have been long-time champions for environmental justice and have supported several efforts to support



beautification efforts at Scanlon. Linda Fernandez collaborated with local families to create a new, colorful sign at the J Street and Tioga Street entrance to welcome the families and children who play everyday.

Supporting students


We donated computers to 12+, a nonprofit that opened their HQ at MaKen South in 2021. The mission of 12+ is to increase educational equity by building school cultures that inspire academic achievement and empower students to pursue education beyond 12th grade. The computers were distributed to seven of their PLUS Centers across Philadelphia (including three within the Kensington neighborhood) and Camden NJ to upgrade technology equipment. 12+ PLUS Centers are hubs of postsecondary, academic, and social support services embedded within the walls of each of 12+ partner schools.
